

Alain Locke to Publish Lectures Given at Fisk

Washington, D. C., March 30.—Dr. Alain Locke, professor of philosophy, Howard university, last Saturday returned from Fisk university, Nashville, Tenn., where he spent the winter quarter as a visiting professor. Dr. Locke was a Rhodes scholar at Oxford university from 1907 to 1910, studied at the University of Berlin from 1910 to 1911, and received the degree of doctor of philosophy from Harvard university, his alma mater, in 1918; gave valuable contribution to the research foundation in the social sciences recently established at Fisk. He gave two courses of extension lectures, one on race contacts and inter-racial relations and the other on the Negro in American literature. These lectures were attended not only by Fisk students, but students and instructors at Vanderbilt university, the George Peabody College for Teachers, Scarritt college and the Southern Y. M. C. A. college. Both series of lectures are to appear shortly in book form.
