10,000 Expected For Meet  
From Aug. 20 To 28

CLEVELAND, Ohio, July 16--(RSS)—Cleveland is busy as plans go forward to receive the 10,000 or more delegates and visitors expected to attend the 38th annual convention of the Improved Benevolent Protective Order of Elks of the World here, August 20 to 28.

Housewives, builders, decorators, business houses, lodges, civic and social leaders have besieged paint stores for color-scheme cards and materials to modernize and renovize their premises. Real estate brokers are meeting the rush of business from those desiring a new modern home in which to entertain guests. Musical and social programs galore are being planned to entertain the visitors.
