## Deny Censor Held Survey Graphic Issue

WASHINGTON — Rumors that
the November issue of Survey
Graphic on the Negro has been
censored by the U. S. and British
governments were denied here this
week by Dr. Alain Locke, editor.
The special issue was due to finally come out on Thursday after
being held up for some weeks.

Dr. Locke, who edited the material, for the edition, told the Defender: "The rumor of censorship is not exact. Submission of articles to various government officials is done as a traditional Survey routine, wherever criticisms were made.

"This does not always involve modification of criticism but is done as a safeguard and check against inaccuracy of statements and as a courtesy to officials involved."

Dr. Locke declared that the edition as finally issued is a "bold incisive statement of the national and international situation."
