

# Music Teachers To Meet At Howard U.

**WASHINGTON.**—The school of music of Howard university and the music educators conference of the Baltimore-Washington area are acting as hosts to the members of the Association of Music Teachers in Negro Schools at their biennial meeting, April 28, 29 and 30, at Howard university here.

Highlights of the meeting will be lectures by Frederick Hall, president of the A.M.T.N.S.; Alain Locke, professor of philosophy at Howard university; and Lilla Belle Pitts, president of the Music Educators National Conference.
