

Meet Of Human Relations Set For Chicago

The 11th annual meeting of the Institute of Human Relations, a conference sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews will be held in the Stevens Hotel here April 17.

Highlighting the meeting will be a session designated "A Declaration of Interdependence." One of the principal speakers will be Dr. Leslie Pinckney Hill, president, Cheyney Training School. He will be supported by Dr. George Stoddard, University of Illinois president and delegate to the Paris UNESCO conference.

There will be a general session followed by discussion groups, and later a session on the use of audio-visual materials.

Among noted figures taking part in group discussions will be St. Clair Drake, co-author of "Black Metropolis," Roosevelt College; Robert R. Taylor, Chicago Housing Authority, and Harry Walker, South Side Planning Board. They will participate as resource leaders in a discussion of "Improving Human Relations through the Community."
