"American citizens, not Negro citizens alone" should be the worthwhile aim of those graduating from Cheyney Training School for teachers, Cheyney, Pa., in the class of '48, the 42 seniors were told at commencement exercises May 23. A paper prepared by the scheduled speaker, Dr. Ralph J. Bunche of the United Nations, was read in his absence by the college president, Dr. Leslie Pinckney Hill. Dr. Bunche, director of the department of Trusteeship and Information for Non-self-governing territories, UN, was called hastily to Paris and then to Palestine in the interests of world peace, so was unable to be present. A number of awards were made to outstanding graduates. "First scholars" rewarded were Dorothy Wilson Moorhead and George Burnett.
