Flower Show

An American flag, accurate in all details, formed by intricate plantings of red, white and blue hyacinths, will be the highlight of the garden presented by Baha'i Temple, Wilmette, in the 1966 Chicago World Flower and Garden Show, March 19-27, in McCormick Place.

Designed by L. Wyatt Cooper, Baha'i's superintendent of buldings and grounds, the flag will be made of King of Blue Hyacinths, Red Jan Bos Hyacinths and White L'Innocence Hyacinths. Behind this floral focal point will be a mural of the Temple measuring 8x5 feet.

The wings and edges of this colorful garden will feature symmetrical planting of tall Scotch pine, American Beauty roses, globe yews, rhododendron, violets (Illinois State Flower), white azaleas, edgings of Santa Linas, a wide expanse of lawn and other shrubs.

This garden, based on the theme of "America the Beautiful", is entitled "The Fruits of one Tree, and the Leaves of one Branch".
